

#### Disciples Living Stewardship

By our very creation, we are children of God. Our relationship with our Lord God is neither a function of our performance, nor a function of worthiness -- past, present or future. God's grace is a free, unmerited gift of immeasurable love. The grace of freedom, healing, joy and peace from God comes to

our heart when we recognize our poorness of spirit and surrender ourselves into God's loving embrace, giving humble thanks for every good gift.

Every person is called uniquely to discipleship, invited to say, "Yes" to the Lordship of Jesus, to deny one's self, take up our cross, and follow Him, and live His example of loving and serving others. But what does that mean practically? How do we live out His call in our daily lives?

Part of the answer is found in **Stewardship**. And what <u>is</u> Christian Stewardship? A steward is "one who manages another's property, finances, or other affairs..." Christian stewards

recognize that all we have, has been given to us by our loving God. When we intentionally shift our mindset and realize that it is our responsibility, privilege and delight as God's children to use our gifts for God's glory, we are living out our stewardship to build up the kingdom of God.

Mindfully choosing to grow and become disciples of Jesus Christ leads naturally to the practice of generous stewardship. It is a privileged responsibility to serve the Lord. Discipleship and stewardship, then, make up the fabric of a Christian life in which each day is lived in an intimate, deep relationship with the Lord, who dwells within each person, and through the many varied and generous gifts God our Father has lavished upon all disciples, we are called to be stewards of these gifts.

God calls us to service through our stewardship in sharing:

Our Time - When we recognize that our very existence is a gift from God, we cannot help but be good stewards of this precious gift. We then choose to regularly take and make time to be with God in prayer and service to loved ones, as well as to those in need.

Our Talents - We are sometimes tempted to feel unworthy, thinking that we are not good enough to have talents, and that talents are reserved for others. This is the opposite of humility. God our Father love us, and has given all people talents and gifts, because God believes in us. To be good stewards of our talents, we must ask and trust Holy Spirit to guide and help us identify our talents, and wisely put them into practice for the purposes for which God has entrusted them to us.

As entrusted them to us.

Our Treasure - Our money, as well as other resources and gifts have been given to us by God the Father to manage and provide for our needs and the needs of others. In life, money is essential, but it is

to be used in service to us, not the other way around. To be good stewards of our treasure, we must be both prudent and generous, sharing and giving to others, not out of guilt or fear, but out of humility and gratitude to God for God's great generosity to us.

DISCIPLESHIP PATHWAY

Jesus gently tells his disciples, of every age and era: "Apart from Me you can do nothing." This includes being faithful disciples, and good stewards of God's gifts, promised through Christ Jesus, and empowered in Holy Spirit. We do not have to do this on our own. Seek, knock, and ask, and trust grace will be given. And in humility of heart, always give thanks. 'Go, therefore, and be creative in your active stewardship of making disciples.'

( )ne cannot love ( 3od and money. Is money a "god" that



we put before God? Offering a portion of our wealth through stewardship frees us from becoming a slave to money or belongings. It increases our dependence on God and our trust that God will provide all that we need.

First Reading (Amos 8:4-7)  $\sim$  The Lord God will be justly severe toward those who intentionally and purposefully defraud the poor

and cheat the needy. God is kind, merciful and forgiving to all people, and expects the same from each person.

**Second Reading** (1 Timothy 2:1-7++)  $\sim$  Paul stresses the importance of our intercessory prayer, thanksgiving, and blessings for one another. There is one God, and one mediator, Christ Jesus, who offered himself as a ransom for all. God desires everyone - Jews and Gentiles alike - to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth of the Gospel of Love.

**Gospel** (Luke 16:1-13) ~ Jesus teaches his disciples with the Parable of the dishonest steward, who mismanages his master's property. Knowing he will be dismissed, the steward reduces the debts owed to his master, in an attempt to ensure he will have people to turn to when he loses his position as the right hand man. It may seem that Jesus' teaching condones the steward's fraudulent behavior, however, the sayings that follow suggest that the interpretation is that we cannot serve two masters, both God and money.

By sharing his own struggles, Henri Nouwen (1932-1996) mentored us all, helping us to pray while not knowing how to pray, to rest while feeling restless, to be at peace while tempted, to feel safe while still anxious, to be surrounded by a cloud of light while still in darkness, and to love while still in doubt. ~ Ron Rolheiser, "Seeking Spirituality"

 $\mathbb{W}$  e are called to be children of the light, not of worldly things. Let us pray for the wisdom, discernment and integrity to use generously our time, talents, and treasures for the wealth of God's whole kingdom, not just ourselves. Let us become mindful of the times we are being selfishly entitled. The world doesn't revolve only around us.

As God's Church, we continue to walk as Pilgrims of Hope in this Jubilee Year - Dec. 24th, 2024 to Jan. 26th, 2026. A Jubilee Year occurs every 25 years in the Catholic Church. The Theme for this Year 2025 is: Blessed are those who have not lost hope. ~ Sirach 14:2 Throughout the remaining days of this year, let us continue to celebrate the Jubilee as "Pilgrims of Hope",

and journey, striving to rediscover our need for God, and deepen our daily prayer.

As Christians who believe with faith in God, we are encouraged to make prayer a strong foundation of our life. As individuals, as community, and as people of every nation of the world, let us make opportunities, and

exercise the privilege to rediscover the absolute need for daily prayer, and contemplative actions through God's holy Word.

May we walk each day as Jesus' Pilgrims of Hope, helping and inspiring others to hope and come to believe in the promises and salvation of our gracious and loving Lord God.
