**Gospel** (Luke 17:5-10) ~ With grace, the disciples have the humility to ask Jesus to increase their faith. Jesus tells them that there is hope and great potential, even in a person with faith the size of a tiny mustard. The disciples are encouraged to do their duty by being of service to others through the power of God's grace.

In the spirit of gratitude, we will celebrate our Canadian Thanksgiving within the context of the usual Sunday liturgies next weekend, Oct. 11th at 4pm Mass, and Oct. 12th at the 9am

& 11am Mass (no Mass on Monday). Seasons and celebrations, Presence and praise, flavors and faith, grace and growth... Each liturgical year begins with the First Sunday of Advent in November/December, and flows into each season - from Advent to Christmas, to Ordinary Time, into Lent, Easter, and a second Season of Ordinary Time. The year culminates with the *Feast of Christ the King*, our Parish's special Feast Day near the end of November each year, and we begin

the circle anew. We are presently journeying in the Church's second **Season of Ordinary Time** toward Advent and the beginning of the new liturgical year. This present season is "ordinary" not in the sense that it is 'plain', 'uneventful', or 'usual', but because it is 'counted', or more accurately, 'ordinal', as we wait and watch in joyful hope, keeping pace with the 'order' of God's discerning and wise timing and will.

Like Habakkuk in today's First Reading, when we pray, it sometimes may feel like God is not answering, especially when things don't turn out the way we have envisioned them to unfold. Be patient, and trust with faith. God is already and always nurturing our tiny mustard-seed-sized faith. We have to remain open hearted and open minded. God hears all our prayers, wipes all our tears, guides our steps, and will answer us in God's perfect wisdom, and perfect timing. Be faithful and true, waiting and watching in joyful hope for the fruition of God's wondrous answers, in God's will.

Let us humbly ask and allow the Lord Jesus to grace and nurture our tiny mustard seeds of faith. May we open our eyes to see and always give thanks to the Lord God, who makes great things happen in our hearts and lives, in our Parish, in our families, in our neighborhoods, and in the world.
